



The purpose of the program is to help international students integrate into terrorist attack on October 7. TAU is now hosting 10 refugee families from Sderot in our campus dormitories and is continuing to do more. • Holding Space for Victims – TAU's Smolarz Auditorium is currently the site of a memorial for those missing and murdered as a result of the October 7 terrorist attacks. On each of the auditorium's 1,000+ seats is a picture and name of a victim. Called "United Against Terrorism," and led by the Student Union in collaboration with TAU, the project aims to demonstrate the magnitude of the horror that has taken place. Learn more.
