Spring Semester 2019 - Courses in BA Liberal Arts Program that Run According to the Israeli Semester Dates

The below courses are 2 or 4 credit courses which are part of the BA Program in Liberal Arts (taught in English). Study Abroad students must be aware that the end dates of the courses are in mid June (beyond the dates of the regular study abroad calendar). In cases where there is no final in-class exam, students may be able to take these courses and leave according to the study abroad calendar (May 23) and instead do an additional course assignment to make up for the missing weeks of the course and the final take home exam or paper. **Again, this is only in cases where there is no in-class exam component as noted below.** If you are interested in taking these courses, you should first discuss this with the TAU International Office Academic Coordinator Yael Gazit (yaelga@tauex.tau.ac.il) to understand the final class and exam dates and the possibilities for these courses. If a student decides to stay longer in order to complete a course and an in-class exam, additional housing costs will apply and housing is not guaranteed.
