

# The Circle of Life – from Birth to Old Age

## **Course Description**

In this course, students will learn about human development during the life span by studying the various medical fields in the classroom, and through clinical exposure by joining doctors on their clinical ward rounds in the various departments and conversing with patients. In addition, the students will be trained by Magen David Adom to provide Pre Hospital Trauma Life Support (PHTLS), will take a course at the Israel Defense Forces Medical Corps training base, and during the semester, course participants will also become Magen David Adom ambulance volunteers in the afternoons.

## **Course Objectives**

- 3. Learning about medical ethical issues arising during the treatment of patients
- 4. Learning to accept other people who are different

- 9. Tour of the Gastroenterology Institute and acquaintance with the various tests performed
