This course will introduce the conflict from its initial stages starting from the first waves of Zionist immigration to Palestine through the 1948 war and the establishment of the state of Israel. It will focus on the emerging features of the conflict, the struggle between the Palestinian Arab and Jewish Nationalist movements, and the regional and international involvement in these events. The course will conclude with a discussion of the current age of uncertainty in the region and the impact of non-state actors (such as Hezbollah and Hamas) on the conflict, in an effort to bring the class up to the present. Possible solutions to the conflict that have been suggested will be evaluated within the realm of conflict resolution studies.

- Official transcripts from all higher education institutions attended
- Demonstrated command of English exams: TOEFL test results (minimum score: written 582, computer-based 223, or iBT 89) or the IELTS test (minimum score: 6.5)
